DIGGING DEEPER

Looking at the passage below, why do you think John emphasizes that loving others is a commandment?

How does God's love for us compel us to love others?

1 John 4:19-21, ESV – ¹⁹ We love because he first loved us. ²⁰ If anyone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen. ²¹ And this commandment we have from him: whoever loves God must also love his brother.

When reading verses about seeking God, we see that He is always near. What insight do the following verses give regarding how and why we should seek God?

Why is seeking God in our own lives important when trying to love our neighbors as ourselves?

Acts 17:26-27, ESV – ²⁶ And he made from one man every nation of mankind to live on all the face of the earth, having determined allotted periods and the boundaries of their dwelling place, ²⁷ that they should seek God, and perhaps feel their way toward him and find him. Yet he is actually not far from each one of us,

Isa 55:6, ESV - 6 "Seek the LORD while he may be found; call upon him while he is near;

Prov 8:17, ESV – ¹⁷ I love those who love me, and those who seek me diligently find me.

Jer 29:13, ESV - 13 You will seek me and find me, when you seek me with all your heart.

Ps 145:18, ESV – ¹⁸ The LORD is near to all who call on him, to all who call on him in truth.
